BUDGETING ACTIVITY #2: MONEY DOESN'T BROW ON TREES

This activity will help you and your family talk about the importance of household finances while raising awareness about the monthly cost of things you take for granted such as lights, hot water, heat, and a place to live.

You and your family will learn why you can't always purchase that new video game, toy, clothing or upgrade for your house, and why it is important to save for those kinds of things because money does not grow on trees.

Materials needed:

- Play money
- Your monthly household bills
- Paper

- Pens, pencils, or markers
- Calculator

How to play:

- 1) Determine your monthly budget.
- 2) Give each child an appropriate amount of play money to cover monthly household expenses and give some spending money.
- 3) Have everyone sit down and review the actual household bills (water, mortgage, cable, electricity, phone, etc.)
- 4) Explain each bill and discuss the bills as a family. Have the children pay the amount due with their play money.
- 5) The kids can decide what to do with the money they have left after the bills are paid. Discuss ways for them to save the money to purchase something they'd like or how they could donate to a worthy cause.
- 6) As a family, talk about the ways you could save money on household expenses, so there's more money left each month for other things they may want to purchase.

Can you save water by turning off the faucet while brushing your teeth?

Can you save electricity by making sure the lights are off when no one is in the room?

Can an extra blanket or sweatshirt keep you just as warm as turning up the heat?

Can you clip coupons for groceries?

Could you eat at home instead of going to a restaurant or getting takeout?

7) Repeat this game each month and compare the current month's bills to the previous month's bills so everyone can see the savings for themselves!

BUDGETING ACTIVITY #4: CAN YOU FIND IT FOR LESS?

This activity is a great way to get your entire family involved in working toward a common goal on a budget. Parents and children can work together to put on a fun night for the entire family while learning how to make the most of the money you have.

Materials needed:

- Paper
- Pens, pencils, or markers
- Calculator

- Scissors
- Tape
- Household materials

How to play:

- 1) As a family, brainstorm a list of 2-3 items that the family may want to purchase.
- 2) Discuss how much you think these things might cost and come up with an estimate.
- 3) Search online, flip through catalogs, and browse weekly sales circulars as a family to figure out the actual cost of the item on your list.
- 4) Discuss how an item may cost less online, but by adding shipping costs, the total may actually be higher than a store that offers free shipping or at a physical store. Add shipping costs where applicable.
- 5) Write the various prices from each store next to each item.
- 6) Pull your original estimates for each item and discuss how close or far off you were from your estimates. Would you consider different makes or models based on the prices you found?
- 7) Commend the family for taking the time and care to find low-cost alternatives to items of interest.

After everyone has looked for the best deal, discuss as a family where the best place would be to purchase the item. Weigh options such as:

- How close the store is to your house consider time and gas prices.
- Online shipping fees.
- Reward points that may help to defray the expense at certain stores.
- Extended warranties.
